Preparing for your Endoscopy (EGD)

After administering IV sedation, Dr. Narváez passes a lighted, flexible instrument (endoscope) through the mouth and back of the throat to allow examination of the esophagus, stomach and duodenum.

In preparation for your EGD follow a regular diet the day before your procedure. Starting at midnight the night before the exam you may no longer consume any food or liquids. All medication must wait to be taken till after the procedure unless otherwise indicated below, such as blood pressure medication. Should any biopsies be taken they will be sent to a pathologist who will send our office the results within a week, at which time we will schedule you for a follow up visit so that Dr. Narváez may go over the reports with you.
